It's a lovely little town. I really enjoyed the atmosphere there. At one market, other volunteers and I were even interviewed by the local television station.







The summer was intensive. Very intensive. It firstly started by the second part of the Leadership Academy. It was full of workshops to prepare us for for the next workcamps as leaders.


It was great to introduce the other participants to some belgian meals during the demo-camp. I presented them the fat *mitrailette*. I think they enjoyed it.

After these intense weeks in Lukovistia and Slatinka, I went to Hamburg for two weeks, for another international project.

Change of atmosphere. This time, it was at the Neuengamme memorial, a former concentration camp.

It was about maintaining the site but also participating in very interesting exhibitions. It was a very enriching experience, especially in terms of citizenship.

For me, the duty to remember is very important, especially in a context where anti-Semitism is increasing in Europe and in the world, I am thinking for example of the terrible attacks of October 7.

I also learned a lot of anecdotes about the history of the camp. The salary of SS personnel, for example, which ranged from 180 to 240 Reichmarks per month. They even had Christmas bonuses...

I also learned about the female SS supervisors. In 1945, more than 400 female supervisors were employed. They were recruited through newspaper advertisements and professional qualifications were not required. After 1945, former female guards claimed they had been forcibly requisitioned. When lies come after cruelty...

I believe that this workcamp will be an experience that I will not forget. We even had the opportunity to speak with a survivor of the holocaust and also with the second generation.

The daughter of a deportee and the son of an SS man came together to tell us about their story. It was very enriching!

I took the opportunity of being in Hamburg to travel to Denmark. I hoped to reach Kolding but, alas, that day, there was chaos on the rails and I had to resign myself to taking a bus. It was a long road but I finally arrived in Padborg.

An experience of a few hours but great. It was my first time in a Scandinavian country.





A magical weekend working in the woods and meadows in an atmosphere that only autumn can bring




I think this is my biggest disappointment with this volunteering: (Having to move back two kilometers from the goal.

It made me happy to participate in such solidarity actions. These are things that are close to my heart.


