



I have studied in an university that allowed me to study, at the same time, two foreign languages (in my case English and Spanish) and a series of specialization subjects according to our own interest.







I consider myself a sociable person, but also empathetic, friendly and always ready to help others and learning new things.

What you will need are just a little bit of courage, trust and a sending organization.




HOSTING AND SENDING ORGANIZATIONS










MYFIRST IMPRESSIONS OF BA

For me it was very difficult, but it was helpful because it helped us to be closer to this country, especially with local people.



MY WORKSHOP




During my ESC I did a workshop, named INEX Messenger, about a topic I was interested to speak about.

At the end we packed our things and we returned back to BA,












LEADERSHIP ACADEMY II

I also had a change to present my workshop for the 2nd time. At the end we attended an exam about leading workcamps.








MEETING WITH OTHER OTHER VOLUNTEERS

We could spend some days together with other ESC volunteers from different countries twice.


The 1st in BA - On-Arrival training, the 2nd in Smolenice Castle - Mid-term evaluation meeting.

We received also some advices, not only for the period we will stay here, but also for our future lifes!






HELPING HOMELESS PEOPLE

For a short period on Sundays, close to a church here in Bratislava, I gave food to homeless people.


I discovered this opportunity thanks to our coordinator when she spoke to us about some a day volunteering activities.




During the camp, we explored Presporkovo and Bratislava.

We organized activities with children, visited a karaoke bar and a bowling alley, and they learned about mobbing.


By the end, we had all formed strong friendships, and many of us cried when the camp ended.




